Why study Health and Social Care?

Are you thinking about a future working in the health and social care sector? Do you want to work with and support children, young people and vulnerable adults?

If the answer to these questions is 'yes' then Health and Social Care may be for you!

Health and social care is one of the fastest growing sectors in the UK with demand for both health and social care employees continuously rising. Approximately 3 million people are currently employed in the sector including social care employees such as **care assistants** and **social workers.** They do incredible work to support people to be as independent as possible in their own homes, care homes or nursing homes. Healthcare employees, such as **doctors**, **pharmacists**, **nurses**, **midwives healthcare assistants** and **physiotherapists**, work with individuals to enhance their quality of life by improving their health.
