How do I read my timetable?

You will be given a timetable on your first day at school. This will tell you exactly where you need to be for each lesson during the day. Your timetable also helps you plan what you need to take to school the following day – it is always a good idea to pack your bag the night before! The example below shows you how a timetable looks and contains some helpful notes to explain how you read your timetable. Please note - this is not your actual timetable!

We have five lessons a day. Each lesson is one hour long. Remember tutor time starts the day at 8.45 (but is not shown here). The times of each lesson can be found in the Newsletter.


This dark line indicates it is break time after lesson 2 (11.00pm).

This dark line indicates it is lunch time after lesson 4 (1.20pm).

This is the name of the subject – in this case it is English Language.

Most subjects in the timetable above are self-explanatory.

Others less obvious are: Performing Arts (Drama and Music), Digital Communication (ICT) and SEL or Social and Emotional Learning (Personal, Social and Health Education). "What do the codes mean in each box?"



This is the room number where the lesson takes place. If it starts with a 'J' then the lesson is in Johnson building. If it is an 'A' then it is in Anson building. Signs in each building will then guide you to the room number. It is not too difficult!

These are the teacher's initials – here FG refers to Mrs Gurmin (Head of English). Your timetable will come with a list of the names of your teachers and their initials so you can work it out!
