Recent Whole School review Feedback

I am pleased to say that we recently commissioned a whole school review across all areas of provision here at Stafford Manor High School.

There were a wide range of positive feedback about the provision we have in place for our fabulous students here. The review recognised that we have improved a wide range of aspects of provision here including curriculum planning, teaching and learning, behaviour, personal development and attendance.

The recent work school leaders have done to improve behaviour and rewards systems was also commented upon and students also commented very favourably on the improvements they are experiencing through our new rewards provision. We are pleased with this and also that students recognised this has improved significantly.

'Leaders are making good progress on developing a sense of belonging and pride in the school. Student leadership opportunities, a revised rewards policy and redecoration of parts of the site have been positive actions to improve this area.'

The improvements seen around the consistency of teaching and learning approaches being adopted and implemented within school are leading to students producing better work and being much clearer about what they need to learn each half term.

You will be asked to have your child's unique **HAF code** to hand to book the activities of your choice.



Remembrance Day—11 November 2024



Stafford Manor High School held our annual Remembrance Day Service on Monday 11 November at 11.00 a.m. Staff and students joined together to remember our fallen heroes from both World Wars and for all who have fallen more recently, in atrocities of war since.


Mr Mainwaring led a heartfelt service which was received with dignity by our students.

"We wear a poppy to remember people in the past. People like Ernest Parker, George Housby and Joseph Lloyd who all left Stafford during the First World War to fight in France and Belgium. Each of them knew they were putting their lives on the line to serve their country to ensure that the allied forces were victorious.

Unfortunately, none of those men saw that victory. Each of them now lies buried in the fields of France and Belgium, and for Ernest Parker and George Housby, they have no known grave. Ernest and George's family never knew what happened to their loved ones and could not go and say 'goodbye'.

However, their names live on today because we wear a poppy.

We wear a poppy to remember all men and women who have served in our armed forces over the last century in other significant conflicts too, for example in the Falklands, Iraq and Afghanistan.


